A Message from Our Administrators

Dear Heritage Community,

Before students entered the doors of the school building in August 2020, the staff, faculty, and school board stood outside the front door praying for the upcoming academic year. The Covid 19 pandemic had not abated. The large school districts in Larimer County made the decision to keep the doors of their school buildings closed and planned to teach students remotely. Heritage Christian Academy made a different decision, planning to open the front door of our building to in-person instruction and learning. On that August morning, we had no idea what the immediate future held, but we believed God was making a way for us in the midst of uncertainty. As we followed, we grew.

Grew in numbers. Because of HCA's Biblical distinctives and commitment to excellence, several families from other schools chose to enroll their students at Heritage. God expanded the Heritage community and simultaneously increased the impact of faculty and staff on the lives of young people.

Grew in capacity. The increase in student enrollment brought blessings and challenges. Growth in student enrollment combined with the challenges of conducting in-person instruction during the Covid-19 pandemic resulted in physical, emotional, and spiritual challenges for faculty, staff, and students. All faculty and staff members had to physically and mentally adjust to wearing masks, remaining socially distanced, and enforcing social distancing rules among a growing student population. Students had to adapt to a changed learning environment. Those required adjustments to daily practices added emotional stress for all. The spiritual challenge that arose was to trust that God would provide the strength, grace, peace, energy, and wisdom needed for each day. Even on the hardest days, God faithfully provided all that we needed. As we walked in His provision, our capacity to creatively meet the demands of the day grew as the year progressed.

Grew in knowledge and wisdom. Moving through the blessings and challenges of the 2020-2021 academic year deepened the reality that every day is a gift from God. Faculty and staff continually refined practices to adapt to everchanging social, academic, and spiritual culture. 

Strategic Planning *Goals for the Future*

One of the responsibilities of the HCA Board is to define a Five-Year Strategic Plan. A Strategic Plan is a document the Board uses to communicate with the Administration and the School Body the long range goals it sees the Lord leading Heritage to drive to and the actions needed to achieve those goals. The Strategic Plan, coupled with the HCA Mission and Vision, is used by both the HCA Administration and the HCA Board to prayerfully make decisions each day, each week, and each month.

Every year during its annual retreat, the Board reviews the Strategic Plan to ensure that the roadmap it lays out still fits the path the Lord has for the school. Every two or three years, the Board undertakes a more in-depth assessment and update of our Strategic Plan, which helps to extend it out to a five year perspective.

This school year, the Board launched a Strategic Planning Committee, led by Jason Kraft. Under Jason's leadership, the Lord blessed our efforts and brought a group of six HCA parents together along with five teachers and administration, and five Board Directors to update our Strategic Plan. Through initial discussions, the Committee was subdivided into five teams focused on the following areas:

1. Facilities
2. Communications and Alumni
3. Development
4. Enrichment
5. School Experience

Each team worked diligently to assess the current state of their area and understand opportunities for the school to grow and improve to better serve our families, our students, and our Lord. A set of recommendations from each team was presented to the Board for prioritization and consideration. This is one of the more difficult responsibilities of the Board — look at a large set of opportunities, knowing that the school only has the capacity to properly execute on a small number of initiatives at any given time, and make the difficult choices on which opportunities to engage in now and which opportunities need to be considered at a later time.

The final decision of the Board was to launch strategic initiatives focusing on three of the areas.

1. Facilities: Establish a Facilities Partnership with FoCEF to ensure continued improvement of HCA's building and grounds
2. Communications: Create a unified and consistent communication experience for our stakeholders
3. School Experience: Expand HCA's Mental Health Support Systems

The Board is extremely grateful to the many parents who sacrificed their time and energy to support this year's update to the HCA Strategic Plan.

Alicia Gibson (Lans)


Class of 2013 / Teaches 1st Grade


3rd Grade during 2020-21 school year



Financial and Fundraising Annual Report





In 2007, Friends of Christian Education Foundation (FOCEF) was founded with the purpose of providing facilities and other financial support to Heritage Christian Academy. Since our inception, the Foundation focused on property management and construction. Though these activities are still core to the Foundation, we are expanding our focus to fundraising on behalf of Heritage. As such, we will be using our other legal (dba) name **Heritage Christian Foundation (HCF)** for all future communications. We are the same organization with the same mission with an expanded focus on fundraising.

New and Retiring Foundation Board Members

The Foundation is comprised of volunteers who serve Heritage Christian Academy by focusing on facilities and financial support. This past year we added two new Directors to the Foundation while two longtime Directors concluded their service. Brent Holcombe recently joined the Foundation. Brent's wife Cathy serves as a Director on the HCA Board. Brent and Cathy have two children at Heritage and have hosted four international students. Jason Kraft, who previously served as a Director, rejoined the Foundation. Jason also serves as a Director on the HCA Board. Jason and Cheri have 4 children who attended Heritage.

Steve Lesondak and Jon Friedrich stepped down as Directors of the Foundation, concluding their long and dedicated service to the Foundation and Heritage. As many know, Steve and Jon are founding members of the Foundation and served for over 13 years. Their servant's heart, dedication, and efforts cannot be overstated; they will surely be missed. On behalf of the Foundation and Heritage Christian Academy, please join us in thanking Steve and Jon for their dedication and service.

Our Next Chapter: Land Purchase

After a decade of prayer, years of consideration and discussion, and 18-months of planning and negotiation, the Foundation purchased 13+ acres for the benefit of Heritage. The new property is located to the west and adjacent to our current property. All glory to God for His amazing provision. The Foundation Board and HCA Board appointed a joint committee that will lead the development of a master plan for the property. We want your input on how best to use this property to fulfill the vision and mission of Heritage. The committee will be reaching out in the coming months for your input and participation. Please join us!

Heritage Christian Foundation is the founding and supporting organization for Heritage Christian Academy. Legally formed as Friends of Christian Education Foundation (FOCEF), our mission is to provide facilities and financial support to HCA. We own and operate the building that houses HCA while leasing the remainder of the building to commercial tenants allowing us to use the net income from our operations to support the school. In addition to providing a below-market lease to HCA, we provide annual scholarships to HCA students, sponsor several annual HCA events, and provide other financial support when possible. Beginning in 2021, the Foundation is increasing our focus on fundraising. All to the Glory of God and the benefit of the students and families of HCA.

The Foundation of Heritage's “3 Pillars of Education”

At Heritage we have three “Pillars of Education” that lay out our philosophy for everything we do. These pillars support everything we stand for, how we operate, what our mission is and why we are here.

Authentic Faith Academic Excellence Nurturing Environment

We think it's important to share what the foundation of those pillars are. It's very simple, ***the foundation is the Bible***. Each pillar stands firmly on the unwavering truth of the Holy Bible. At Heritage Christian Academy we know without any hesitation or doubt that the Bible is the inerrant, perfect, and the authoritative word of God. Period. Simply put, the words we read in scripture come from the same voice and hold the same power and majesty as the words that spoke all creation into existence. We know that God's truth remains the same regardless of current cultural whims and doesn't change with time. Academic Assessments



● **DIBELS: Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills**





Figure 1: Beginning of Year Assessment

During the 2020-21 academic year, for the first time, HCA conducted Beginning of the Year (BOY), Middle of the Year (MOY), and End of the Year (EOY) benchmark DIBELS assessments with all students (n) in grades K-8. The data in Figure 1 reflects the BOY results, n = 167.

The data in Figure 2 represents the EOY results, n = 167.

The results indicate HCA students demonstrated growth in their literacy skills. In the coming year, teachers will receive professional development that will equip them to do monthly progress monitoring in their classrooms which will inform more targeted individual support for developing literacy skills.

STEAM (Science Technology Engineering Art Math)

HCA launched a new STEAM program in 2020-21. In partnership with Colorado Early Colleges (CEC), all HCA students grades K – 8 received a Chrome Book on which they took courses from My Tech High (MTH). Examples of MTH courses include computer programming, digital photography, Lego robotics, and digital literacy. Grade K – 7 students also completed various KIWI Crates that allowed them to build a variety of projects such as, illuminated solar systems, electric pencil sharpeners, drip irrigation systems, and cannonball launchers. A few high school students participated in MTH courses for an elective credit. Drone photography and advanced digital photography were two popular choices. Teachers enthusiastically voted to participate in the program for 2021-22. Students grew in their familiarity and usage of technology as they used their Chrome Books for projects in all content areas. HCA looks forward to implementing this program with greater fidelity during 2021-22 being more familiar with the MTH courses and requirements.

IOWA Assessments

In 2020-21, HCA adopted the IOWA Assessments as our achievement testing tool. Testing took place in April, 2021. The scores of HCA students were interpreted through a large data base populated by private and public schools throughout the USA. Composite (average score of all content area assessments) Grade Equivalent Average (GEA) scores are represented in Table 1.

Aggregate HCA scores were above national average scores. Individual results were shared with students and families. Individual and composite data will be used to identify gaps in instruction and meet individual learning needs for the 2021-22 academic year.

PSAT Assessments

Students in grades 10 and 11 took the PSAT assessments during fall semester; students in grades 8 and 9 took the PSAT assessments in spring semester. Table 2 represents the test results in average grade level scores.


